

1 REGISTRATION

- 1.1 The Deloitte Ride Across Britain (“Event”) is a multi-stage cycle event scheduled to take place between 5-13 September 2020 and is organised by Threshold Sports Ltd (“Threshold”) and shall be referred to as the “Deloitte Ride Across Britain” or such other title as Threshold may advise.
- 1.2 Only persons aged 18 years or above as of 5 September 2020 may register for the Event.
- 1.3 Applicants must complete and submit the online registration form (“Online Registration Form”), which can be found at www.rideacrossbritain.com (the “Event Website”), and pay the entry fee (the “Entry Fee”) and the booking fee between £10 - £15.11 per place (the “Booking Fee”).
- 1.4 All successful applicants (hereinafter referred to as “Participants”) will be notified by way of an email confirmation that they have been allocated a place to take part in the Event (“Online Confirmation”).
- 1.5 Places in the Event are strictly limited and therefore applications are subject to availability. Subject to Clauses 1.2 to 1.4 (inclusive) above, Threshold will consider applications on a first come, first served basis by eligible Participants (which Threshold shall determine in its absolute discretion) and otherwise in accordance with these Rules and Regulations.
- 1.6 The relevant date for registrations shall be the date the Participant receives the Online Confirmation. Threshold is not responsible for technical, hardware or software failures of any kind, lost or unavailable network connections, or failed, incomplete, garbled or delayed computer/Internet transmissions or other errors or malfunctions of any kind which may prevent receipt by Threshold of an Online Registration Form or receipt by an applicant of an Online Confirmation. For the avoidance of doubt, if, for any reason whatsoever, an applicant does not receive an Online Confirmation, said applicant shall not be considered to be a Participant and Threshold shall not be responsible for the applicant’s failed application.
- 1.7 All online registrations must be received by Threshold on or before midnight on Sunday 30th August 2020 (“Entry Deadline”). Any online registration received by Threshold after the Entry Deadline will not be accepted. This deadline is subject to change if all entries are full prior to the above date.
- 1.8 Payments should be made directly to Threshold Sports, via the online payment system. Participants may elect to pay the Entry Fee and Booking Fee in full on registration, or pay a deposit (“the Deposit”) and then further payments (“Instalment Payments”) and the Booking Fee to confirm their place on the Event. These two different payment options are detailed in Section 2.

2.3 Instalment Payments are not available for Charity Entry packages.

2.4 If a package is bought after an instalment date, the missed instalment(s) will be charged along with the deposit at the point of registration

2.5 Instalment Payments can be opted into at the point of check-out during registration.

2.5.1 If a package is bought after an instalment date, the missed Instalment Payment(s) will be charged along with the deposit at the point of registration

2.5.2 The Instalment Payments will be automatically taken from the original payment card on the dates listed in Clause 2.2. You must ensure that you have sufficient funds to cover this.

2.5.3 The Participant will receive an automated receipt by email after clearance of each payment.

2.5.4 If an Instalment Payment is missed, the Participant would like to pay the remaining balance early, or the payment card needs to be amended, this can be done by the Participant within the ['MyEvents'](#) Portal in the 'Billing Management' section.

2.5.5 If an Instalment Payment is missed and not paid within 15 working days, Threshold reserve the

right to remove the Participant from the Event and their payments refunded in line with the Refund Policy in Clause 3.2

- 2.6 Subject to the other provisions of Section 1, submission of the Online Registration Form, payment of the Entry Fee, receipt of the Online Confirmation shall (together) entitle the Participant to participate in the Event.
- 2.7 The Event is personal to the Participant accepting these Rules and Regulations, and the Participant undertakes and agrees (i) only to participate in the Event wearing the number assigned to his/her registration, (ii) not to authorise or permit any third party to use his/her rider number for the Event and (iii) not to sell, transfer or give any other person the right to participate in the Event and/or use the Participant's number.
- 2.8 If at any time it is discovered that any Participant should have been ineligible to participate in the Event or if participation in the Event should have been refused for any reason whatsoever, Threshold reserves the right to disqualify such Participant from/refuse such Participant entry to the Event. Further, Threshold reserves the right to reject at any time any Online Registration Form which it believes to be fraudulent, or to disqualify at any time any Participant it believes not to have fully complied with these Rules and Regulations from participating in the Event, or in any future Threshold events. Threshold shall not be liable in any way to such Participant as a result of any such disqualification or refusal. It is the Participant's responsibility to ensure full compliance with these Rules and Regulations.
- 2.9 If any provision in these Rules and Regulations, whether in full or in part, is held to be invalid or unenforceable, all other remaining provisions (in full or in part) shall continue to be valid and enforceable.
- 2.10 These Rules and Regulations (and any documents referred to herein) constitute the entire agreement and understanding of the parties and supersede any previous agreement between the parties relating to the Event. Nothing in these conditions shall constitute or be deemed to constitute a partnership between the parties. These Rules and Regulations shall be interpreted in accordance with the laws of England and Wales and any dispute arising hereunder shall be subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the English courts.

3 CANCELLATIONS & REFUNDS POLICY

- 3.1 Any Participant intending to cancel their place in the Event shall inform Threshold as soon as reasonably practicable ("Cancellation Notification").
- 3.1.1 Threshold operates a seven (7) day cooling off period. Accordingly, the Participant is entitled to cancel his/her Entry to participate provided Threshold receives written notice of cancellation within seven (7) days of payment of registration. During this 7 day period the Participant is able to cancel his/her entry and receive a full refund of all fees paid to date (including the Deposit) by emailing info@rideacrossbritain.com. The notice must be received before the end of the seven (7) day cooling off period. The Booking Fee is non-refundable.
- 3.1.2 Thereafter, an amount will be refunded to the Participant as outlined in Clause 3.2, within 30 days of receipt by Threshold of the Cancellation Notification from the Participant.
- 3.1.3 The amount refunded to the Participant is dependent on the date in which the Cancellation is requested and the payment plan the Participant has chosen. These amounts are shown in Clause 3.2.

3.3 PARTICIPANT TRANSFER

- 3.3.1 A Participant can transfer their entry to another individual if notice is given to the Event Organisers. Participants who transfer their Entry can be eligible for a full refund of all Fees paid (minus the Booking Fee and the Administration Fee) subject to Clauses 3.3.1 - 3.3.7.
- 3.3.2 Notice of a Participant Transfer must be done via the Participant's [MyEvents](#) Portal.
- Click Transfer registration to another athlete
 - Enter recipient email address in email address field
 - Enter recipient email address in Confirm email address field and click Submit
 - Confirmation email sent verifying transfer process initiated to transferring Participant and to a new Participant
- 3.3.3 Participant Transfers can only take place if the new Participant wishes to take the same RAB Package
- 3.3.4 The most current Entry Fee and Booking Fee is applied at checkout when the new Participant accepts the transfer by clicking the link within the confirmation email detailed in 3.3.2 This Entry Fee could be higher than that for the original Participant
- 3.3.5 The original Entry Fee is not refunded until the new Participant accepts and completes the transfer process.
- 3.3.6 Refunds are processed within 5-7 business days.
- 3.3.7 The Administration Fee will be deducted automatically from the refund as follows:
- Before 23:59, 24th July 2020: £75
 - Before 23:59, 30th August 2020: £85

3.4 PARTICIPANT CHANGE OF PACKAGE

- 3.4.1 A Participant can change their package if notice is given to the Event Organisers.
- 3.4.1.1 Notice of the change must be communicated by the Participant by emailing info@rideacrossbritain.com stating clearly the desire to change their entry. The Participant may be required to pay an additional Entry Fee before the package change can be confirmed, which is payable over the phone by calling 0845 486 2012.
- 3.4.2 No changes to a Participants package can be accepted after 23:59 30th August 2020
- 3.4.3 If the Participant is changing to a package with a lower Entry Fee, they will be refunded the difference to the card with which the Participant paid their initial Entry Fee. The refund will not exceed that the Refund Policy outlined in Clause 3.2.
- 3.4.4 If the Participant is changing to a package with a higher Entry Fee, the difference plus any incremental Booking Fees for making the change must be paid before the Participant can complete the change.
- 3.4.5 Once the Fee has been processed, the Event Organisers will send the Participant a new confirmation email, which will act as the new Online Confirmation.

3.5 PARTICIPANT DEFERRAL

- 3.5.1 A Participant is permitted to defer their entry to the following year (2021 event), subject to the following circumstances:

- 3.5.1.1 Notice of the deferral must be communicated by the Participant by emailing info@rideacrossbritain.com stating clearly the desire to defer their entry. The Participant is required to pay the Administration Fee before the package change can be confirmed, which is payable over the phone by calling 0845 486 2012.
- 3.5.2 If the Participant wishes to defer, any Instalment Payments outstanding must be cleared immediately before the Entry Deferral can be processed
- 3.5.3 The Installment Payments and the Administration Fees are both payable over the phone by calling 0845 486 2012
- 3.5.4 The deadline for deferrals and Administration Fees are as follows. No requests for deferrals will be accepted after the below deadlines:

- 3.5.5 Once the correct Entry Fees have been paid and Administration Fee has been processed, the Event Organisers will cancel the Participant registration for 2020. The Event Organisers will not refund the Entry Fee, but will then send the Participant a free of charge web link to sign up to the event the following year.
- 3.5.6 If the Participant wishes to change their package, it is then the responsibility of the Participant to complete following the steps outlined in Clause 3.4 once they have completed their registration for 2021
- 3.5.7 Threshold reserves the right to discontinue the RAB Plus package. Therefore, if a RAB Plus Participant defers their entry to 2021 they may only be able to obtain a Classic package place.
- 3.5.8 The Participant understands that once a deferral has been processed, the Administration Fee is non-refundable under any circumstances. The retained Entry Fee will then be subject to the Refund Policy for 2021.
- 3.5.9 A participant can only defer their entry once. A deferral will not be permitted if the Participant has already deferred previously.

4 DELOITTE RIDE ACROSS BRITAIN

- 4.1 Subject to Clause 4.4 below, the Event will be held between 5-13 September 2020.
- 4.2 The Event is made up of various options (“Packages”):
- 4.2.1 “Classic package”- A nine day package from Land’s End to John O’Groats between 5-13 September 2020
- 4.2.2 “Plus package” – A nine day package from Land’s End to John O’Groats between 5-13 September 2020
- 4.2.3 “England package” - A six day package from Land’s End to Edinburgh scheduled to take place between 5-11 September 2020

- 4.2.4 “Scotland package” - A three day package from Edinburgh to John O’Groats scheduled to take place between 11-13 September 2020
- 4.3 The Event is an arduous multi-day endurance cycling event, involving the completion of a fully signed route. Participants are encouraged to cycle in groups (with chaperone guidance) for reasons of safety, although this is not compulsory.
- 4.4 Threshold reserves the right to change the time, date, route and/or format of the Event and to cancel the Event, in whole or in part, without notice or liability to the Participant. Threshold shall inform the Participant by email of any such change or cancellation.
- 4.5 Threshold reserves the right to remove any Participant from the Event, either during or before it, due to ill health, or any other reason (at Threshold’s discretion) that may render him/her unfit to safely complete the Event. The Participant confirms that they will not take part in the Event if the Participant is suffering from any contagious illness (in particular diarrhea or vomiting symptoms) and confirms that the Participant will report any illness during the Event, to the Event medical team immediately.
- 4.6 Without prejudice to Threshold’s right to remove any Participant from the Event due to ill health pursuant to Clause 4.5 above, the Participant acknowledges and agrees that:
- 4.6.1 If the Participant becomes ill with a non-infectious illness (as determined by the Event medical team) during a stage but wishes to join a subsequent stage, Threshold will, where reasonably practicable and subject to the advice of the Event medical team, transfer him/her to the next base camp. Where such transfer is not reasonably practicable (or where the Event medical team advise against the Participant’s continued involvement in the Event), the Participant shall be removed from the Event.
- 4.6.2 If, however, the Participant becomes ill with an infectious illness (as determined by the Event medical team), the Participant shall be removed from the Event.
- 4.7 The accommodation provided with the Classic package, England package and Scotland package is camping in the identified Event base camps apart from Bath where accommodation will be in a university single occupancy room. The Plus package includes hotel accommodation (either single or double occupancy in a double bedded room) each night on the event, with the exception of Bath when the accommodation will be in University single occupancy rooms and Saturday 12th September, which will be camping, in line with the other packages. Please note that the double occupancy option does not necessarily include twin bedded rooms.
- 4.8 In the event of a Participant having to leave the Event because of injury, illness or voluntary withdrawal, the Participant will be responsible for all repatriation travel costs and organization of onward travel.
- 4.9 Threshold will endeavor to provide every Participant with a completion time but is not responsible for any electronic timing anomalies.
- 4.10 No drugs, illegal substances, performance enhancing substances or intoxicants of any kind are permitted to be used by any Participant either before or during participation in the Event. Threshold reserves the right to refuse attendance at, or participation in, the Event by any persons found to have consumed or to have in their possession any drugs, illegal substances, performance enhancing substances or intoxicants of any kind.
- 4.11 Threshold reserves the exclusive right and license throughout the world (and Participant hereby grants Threshold such exclusive right and licence) to interview and/or photograph and/or film the Participant at the Event (and before and after the Event as Threshold may reasonably require) and to the unlimited, worldwide, sub-licensable right to record, film, reproduce and use in all current and future media (including without limitation, print, audio, visual, audio-visual, virtual media, the Internet, mobile telephony and so-called “3-G” technologies, CD-ROM or DVDs) the Participant’s name, likeness and image or facsimile image, signature, voice, video and film portrayals and other means of identification of the Participant, and any biographical or other information or data related to the Participant (including ride times and results), in connection with the production, advertisement, marketing, promotion or sale of Event sponsor products and/or the promotion, marketing or advertisement of Threshold or any Event sponsor or partner.

- 4.12 As a continuing condition of entry each Participant shall ensure that, for the duration of the Event:
- 4.12.1 Safety approved cycle helmets are worn at all times when cycling;
 - 4.12.2 The Participant is capable of carrying out basic bike maintenance, such as puncture repairs, whilst on the route;
 - 4.12.3 The Participant does not start earlier than the official start time on each day of the Event. Failure to comply with this rule will result in being removed from the event;
 - 4.12.4 The Participant completes each daily stage between the hours of the route operating window (“Route Operating Window”) which is normally 7am to 7pm. In addition, the Participant must start each stage within the start window of one hour (“Start Window”), normally 7am to 8am. Threshold reserves the right to alter the Route Operating Window and the Start Window each day in the event of mitigating circumstances;
 - 4.12.5 The Participant cycles at a minimum average pace of 10mph, or above, each day. Pit stop cut off times will be advertised each day for this pace of rider. If a Participant falls behind this pace then the Participant will be collected by the broom wagon and repatriated to the next base camp.
 - 4.12.6 The Participant understands that pit stop cut off times are guides only. Threshold reserves the right to ask any rider to go on the broom wagon at any time, if they feel they are a risk to themselves, other riders, or are unnecessarily stretching the route support crew, even if they are still within the pit stop cut off times and/ or Route Operating Window.
 - 4.12.7 The Participant understands the three-strike rule and will be asked to leave the Ride after the third strike and not permitted to take part in the remainder of the Event. The Participant would get ONE strike if the Participant:
 - 4.12.7.1 is collected during the day because they fail to make the pit stop cut off times;
 - 4.12.7.2 does not start on a particular day, and travels in the broom wagon to the next basecamp;
 - 4.12.7.3 does not start on a particular day, and organises their own transfer to the next basecamp but needs their bike to be transported by the broom wagon;
 - 4.12.7.4 does not start on a particular day and organises their own transfer to the next basecamp for themselves AND their bike. Riders must still tell Event Control if doing this;
 - 4.12.7.5 has left pit stop 2 within the cut off time but does not reach the finish before that cut off time;
 - 4.12.8 The Participant understands that Threshold shall have no liability whatsoever to any Participant who fails to complete the ride at an average pace of 10mph, but refuses to be collected by the broom wagon, and reserve the right to remove such Participant from the remainder of the Event;
 - 4.12.9 The Participant understands that if they are removed from the Event for whichever circumstances outlined in these rules and regulations, no refund will be given by Threshold or any other party.
 - 4.12.10 His/her bicycle is roadworthy for the Event and equipped with the relevant insurances and documentation;
 - 4.12.11 The Participant does not use a mobile phone whilst cycling but has one on their person in case of emergencies;
 - 4.12.12 Due to the outdoor nature and endurance aspect of the Event, the Participant maintains personal hygiene at all times, and adheres to all hygiene advice provided by Threshold;
 - 4.12.13 The Participant does not use a music player with headphones whilst cycling;
 - 4.12.14 The Participant displays the official event numbers provided at registration in the manner indicated

during the Event;

- 4.12.15 The Participant does not deviate from the official signed route of the Event;
- 4.12.16 The Participant abides by all Event rules and regulations;
- 4.12.17 The Participant acknowledges that it is his/her responsibility to ensure that the Participant has taken out a policy of insurance suitable for his/her participation in the Event.

Example of suitable insurance cover is outlined below, but not limited to:

- A minimum of £2 million 3rd Party Liability Insurance;
- Travel insurance that covers personal travel plans; and
- Insurance that covers personal belongings, including his/her bike

- 4.12.18 The Participant complies with the Highway Code at all times; and
- 4.12.19 The Participant obeys traffic officers and authorised marshals at all times; failure to do so will result in disqualification and removal from the Event.

5 PARTICIPANT WARRANTIES AND UNDERTAKINGS

- 5.1 The Participant acknowledges that participation in the Event is not possible without validly entering into this agreement on these Rules and Regulations and agrees to be bound by these Rules and Regulations.
- 5.2 The Participant agrees at all times during the Event to abide by the reasonable instructions and guidelines of Threshold's staff, nominated representatives, and suppliers and to behave appropriately at all times on the route and in the base camps. Participants acknowledge and agree that Threshold will organise and run the Event and will have sole authority and be the final arbiter on all decisions relating to the following aspects of the Event: health and safety, logistical operations, participation, organisation and rules and regulations.
- 5.3 The Participant understands the endurance demands of the Event and commits to preparing to take part in the Event by:
 - 5.3.1 Complying with the Event monthly training plans (or comparable training advice);
 - 5.3.2 Consistently completing long distance rides (min. 80 miles) before the Event;
 - 5.3.3 Completing a number of training rides on consecutive days in order to experience fatigue brought on by persistent mileage; and
 - 5.3.4 Undertaking regular training within a group in busy road conditions (e.g. roundabouts, major junctions) in order to feel confident out on the road.
- 5.4 The Participant acknowledges that participation in the Event involves inherent risks of accidents and injury.
- 5.5 The Participant acknowledges that the Participant is personally responsible for his/her own belongings during the Event, and that the Participant must collect any personal lost items from lost property before the Participant leaves the Event.
- 5.6 Participation in the Event is at the Participant's own risk. Event administration

- As the Event organiser, Threshold requires a record of your registration details including third party emergency contact details for internal administration purposes in order to properly conduct and to safely administer the Event.
- Threshold will also keep records of medical information provided that it is kept confidential and may be shared only with medical personnel or teams allocated to the Event. This data will be shared securely.
